## **Federal Recommendations**

Each year, the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) publishes immunization schedules for persons aged 0 through 18 years. These schedules summarize recommendations for routine vaccines for children ages 18 years and younger.

## **State Requirements**

Prior to entry, attendance or transfer to preschools, schools (K-12), licensed child care facilities, and family day care homes, each child shall have on file a *Form DH 680, Florida Certification of Immunization*, documenting the completion of all required vaccine doses.
